Light up Lancaster events take place predominantly out of doors and grounds may be muddy and uneven - please wear suitable clothing and footwear, and bring a torch if you wish!



Accessibility - For Light up the Streets on the Friday, accessing the Castle involves a steep cobbled section and the Storey Gardens will also involve some steps. All other events will be city centre based and accessible. For Light up the Skies on the Saturday, disabled parking and viewing is available at Williamson Park (please phone in advance on 01524 33318) and at Salt Ayre.

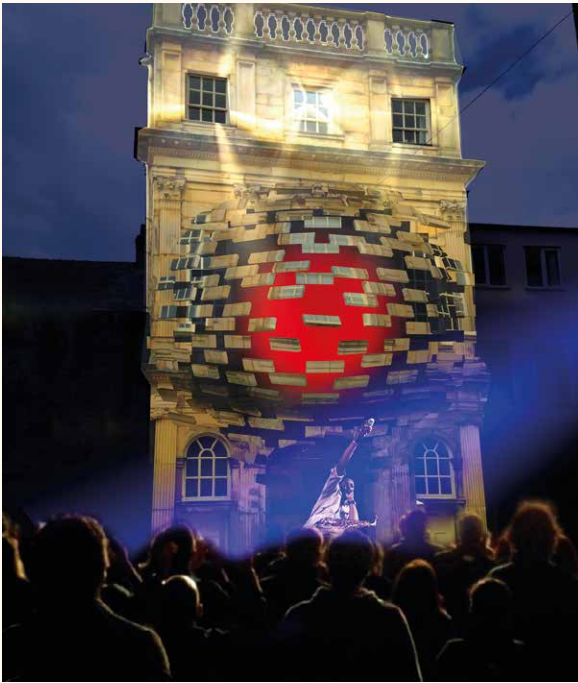

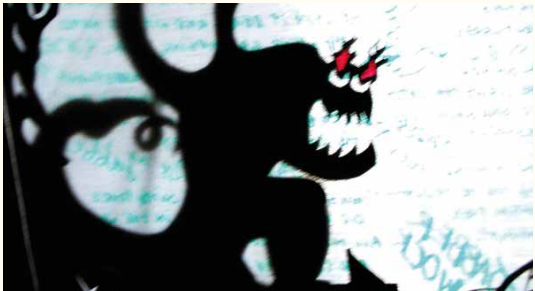


FIREFLY

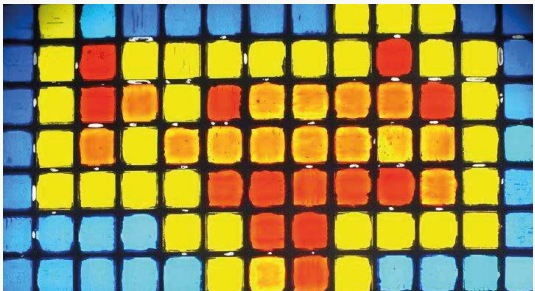

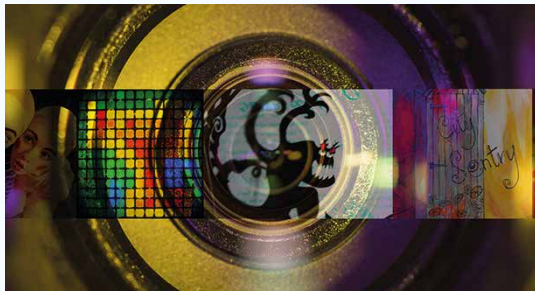

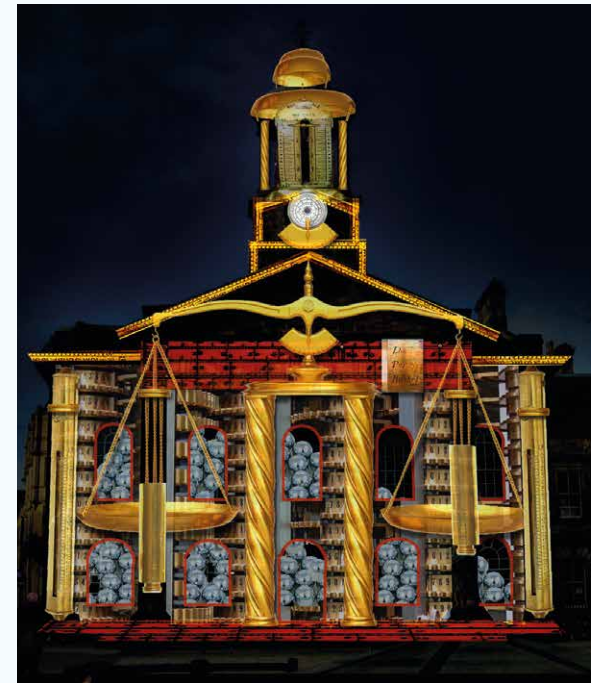
