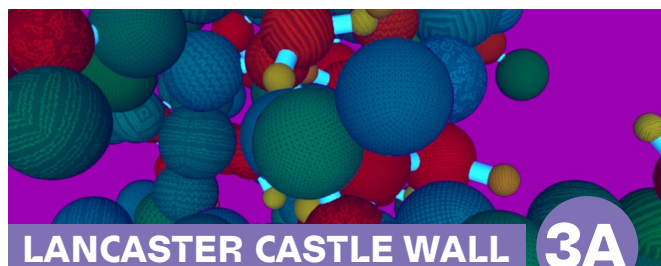


THE STOREY GARDENS

Mycelium – Living Connections By Stevie Thompson

A luminous, ground-based installation inspired by underground fungal networks.

Audiences activate gentle pulses of light through touch and movement — momentary signals that echo the fleeting nature of connection. Like the mycelium itself, the artwork quietly responds, then fades, leaving only traces of shared presence.

Molecular Clouds By Daksha Patel

This beautiful, interactive projection reveals invisible greenhouse gases as ephemeral and colourful molecular forms. It invites audiences to reach out and 'touch' them - removing them from the atmosphere. An engaging, playful and collective way to experience climate change themes.



LANCASTER CASTLE

Still Waters Run Deep By James Hooton, Diego Moral Pombo

Experience Lancaster Castle's John O'Gaunt Gate transformed into a living glacier. Through rhythmic animation and a musical score crafted from the sounds of glacial movement, the artwork challenges our understanding of stillness by revealing the hidden significance and motion of glaciers. The impermanence of these immense structures has a global impact on us all.

An immersive laser light and sound installation, bringing to life Lancashire's voices, songs and stories-celebrating its people and history. Light and sound flow together in a poetic, multisensory experience for all ages. 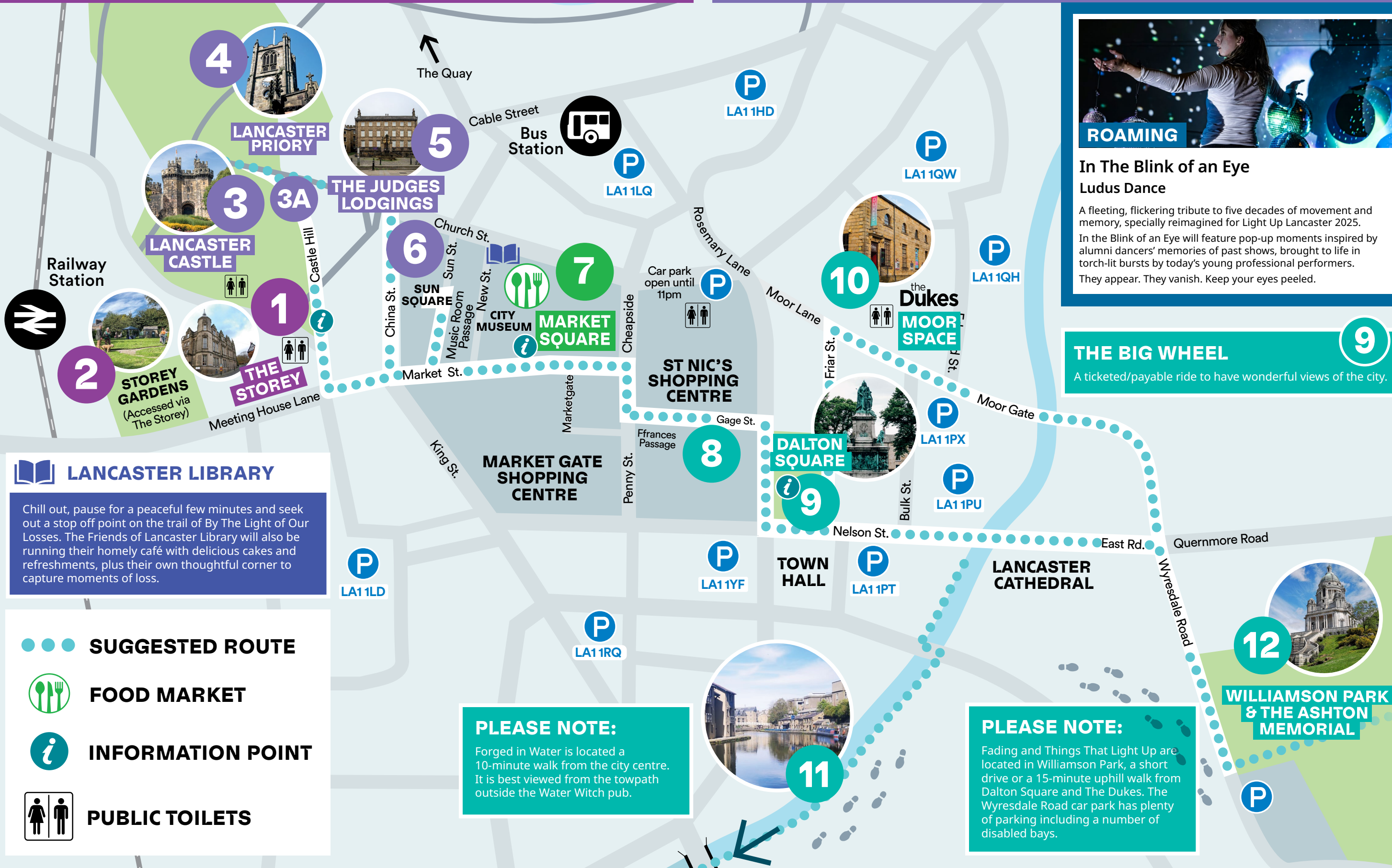


LANCASTER CANAL (View from the Water Witch. Please access from Penny Street Bridge)
